SUBJECT:

Authorizing the Mayor or his designee to accept an award in the amount of \$8,500 from the BayCare Health System Community Benefit Program to support the City's Fresh Rec Stop Program and to execute all documents necessary to effectuate this transaction; approving a supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$8,500 from the increase in the unappropriated balance of the General Fund (0001), resulting from these additional revenues, to the Parks and Recreation Department, Healthy St. Pete Division (190-1587).

EXPLANATION:

The Healthy St. Pete Division operates the Fresh Rec Stop Program at six recreation facilities in St. Petersburg. Through a continuing partnership with BayCare Health System Community Relations, Healthy St. Pete applied to expand the program to five additional recreation center locations in the city. The Fresh Rec Stop Program provides on-site fresh, affordable produce, implements on-site cooking demonstrations, and offers nutrition education information for families. The goal of the program is to increase access to produce, promote healthy behaviors, and increase family support to make healthy lifestyle choices.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Administration recommends that the City Council adopt the attached resolution authorizing the Mayor or his designee to accept an award in the amount of \$8,500 from the BayCare Health System Community Benefit Program to support the City's Fresh Rec Stop Program and to execute all documents necessary to effectuate this transaction; approving a supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$8,500 from the increase in the unappropriated balance of the General Fund (0001), resulting from these additional revenues, to the Parks and Recreation Department, Healthy St. Pete Division (190-1587); and providing an effective date.

COST/FUNDING/ASSESSMENT INFORMATION:

Revenues in the amount of \$8,500 will be received from BayCare Health System and deposited into the General Revenue Fund (0001). A supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$8,500 from the increase in the unappropriated balance of the General Fund (0001), resulting from these additional revenues, to the Parks and Recreation Department, Healthy St. Pete Division (190-1587) is required.
