Subject: Renewing a blanket purchase agreement with Beck Disaster Recovery, Inc. for post-disaster debris compliance monitoring services.

Explanation: On September 6, 2007 City Council approved a blanket purchase agreement for post-disaster debris compliance monitoring services, utilizing City of Palm Bay Contract #74-0-2006/SB. This is the second of four one-year renewal options.

The vendor provides, if needed, post-disaster debris removal monitoring services under the city's direction to ensure full compliance with environmental regulations and Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) requirements. Services include compliance monitoring of contractors' truck weights as well as size and type of debris removed. In addition, the vendor will provide disaster recovery technical support including assistance with documentation and funds recovery from the State of Florida and the FEMA Public Assistance Program, as applicable for eligible work.

There is no cost to the city for entering into the agreement. The rates as outlined in the price schedule, only apply upon the city's authorized request for service after an actual emergency.

The Purchasing Department, in cooperation with the Parks and Sanitation departments, recommends renewal utilizing City of Palm Bay, Florida's Contract #74-0-2006/SB:

The vendor has agreed to hold the terms and conditions of the City of Palm Bay Contract #74-0-2006/SB dated June 29, 2006. The renewal will be effective from April 12, 2009 through April 12, 2010.

Cost/Funding/Assessment Information: Funds will be obtained through the appropriate department's budget. In the event additional funds are needed, a supplemental appropriation will be requested from Council.

A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE SECOND ONE-YEAR RENEWAL OPTION OF AN AGREEMENT (BLANKET AGREEMENT) WITH BECK DISASTER RECOVERY, INC. FOR POST-DISASTER DEBRIS COMPLIANCE MONITORING SERVICES FOR WHICH ACTUAL COST TO THE CITY WILL APPLY ONLY UPON AN AUTHORIZED REQUEST FOR SERVICES; UTILIZING THE CITY OF PALM BAY CONTRACT #74-0-2006/SB; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OR MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO EXECUTE ALL DOCUMENTS NECESSARY TO EFFECTUATE THIS TRANSACTION; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on September 6, 2007, City Council approved an Agreement (Blanket Agreement) with Beck Disaster Recovery, Inc. ("Beck") with 5 one-year renewal options for post-disaster debris compliance monitoring services in the event of a disaster that complies with environmental regulations and Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) requirements; and

WHEREAS, cost to the City, as outlined in the Price Schedule, will apply to the City only upon an authorized request for services after an actual emergency; and

WHEREAS, Section 2-234(e) of the City Code permits the City to utilize competitively bid contracts of other governmental entities when it is in the best interest of the City; and

WHEREAS, on March 6, 2008 City Council approved the first one-year renewal option of the Agreement with Beck; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to exercise the second one-year renewal option of the Agreement with Beck; and

WHEREAS, Beck Disaster Recovery, Inc. has agreed to uphold the terms and conditions of the City of Palm Bay Contract #74-0-2006/SB; and

WHEREAS, the Purchasing Department, in cooperation with the Parks and Sanitation Departments, recommends this renewal.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of St. Petersburg, Florida that the second one-year renewal option to the Agreement (Blanket Agreement) with Beck Disaster Recovery, Inc. for post-disaster debris compliance monitoring services for which actual cost to the City will apply only upon an authorized request for services utilizing the City of Palm Bay Contract #74-0-2006/SB is approved and the Mayor or Mayor's Designee is authorized to execute all documents necessary to effectuate this transaction.

This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.
