



You can help prevent pollutants from reaching our waterways by complying to these best practices.

### **PROPER CLEANING**


- Always empty wash water and mop buckets into a mop sink. Do not pour the water outside or into storm drains.
- Wash off floor mats and garbage cans in a mop sink.
- Inspect outside your restaurant for trash and clean regularly.
- Do not hose off restaurant or kitchen floors to the outside.


### **GARBAGE DUMPSTERS**

- Do not rinse out dumpsters. Request a replacement when it shows signs of wear.
- Keep dumpster lids closed and ensure that the dumpster drain plug is in place and secure.
- Do not dump liquids, fats, oils or grease (FOG) into the dumpsters.
- Avoid overfilling dumpster.

### FATS, OIL AND GREASE (FOG)

- Do not dispose of fats, oils or grease in floor drains, sinks or storm drains.
- Recycle or dispose of in the trash in a sealed container.
- Maintain clean sewer lines and grease traps.
- Use drying agents (kitty litter or towels) to clean up spills.
