PRESENTATION: Mayor will present a proclamation to the Parks and Recreation Department recognizing the month of May as Drowning Prevention Month.

WHEREAS, the State of Florida ranks number one in unintentional drowning deaths for children ages 1 to 4; and

WHEREAS, more than 50% of drowning victims are treated in emergency rooms and require further care; nonfatal drowning can cause severe and permanent brain damage; and

WHEREAS, drowning is quick and silent, adults should closely watch children near backyard pools, public pools, beaches and bathtubs; and

WHEREAS, with formal swimming lessons, barriers and close supervision, these deaths are preventable; and

WHEREAS, through public awareness and education, the City of St. Petersburg Parks and Recreation, and St. Petersburg Fire and Rescue Departments seek to eliminate the devastating effects of drowning;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, BILL FOSTER, Mayor of the City of St. Petersburg, Florida, do hereby proclaim the month of May, 2013



AQUATIC PROGRAMS

Summer Swim Lessons

Swim lessons are offered at all pools for beginner through advanced levels. Lessons are taught by American Red Cross certified instructors for all ages from infant (6 months) to seniors. Classes meet Monday through Thursday for two weeks, 40 minutes each day for two weeks. Both morning and evening times are available. Parent/Child classes are 30 minutes. Private lessons can also be scheduled.

Reduced rates are available for St. Petersburg residents who qualify for fee assistance.

Special Olympics Training Program

The Special Olympics training program is based at North Shore Aquatic Complex. This program gives individuals with intellectual disabilities the opportunity to train for swim competition. The goal of this program is to increase the individual's cardiovascular and muscle strength and provide an opportunity to socialize with other athletes with similar disabilities.


Lifeguard Courses

City of St. Petersburg Aquatics offers Lifeguard Training, Water Safety Instructor, CPR for the Professional Rescuer, AED Training and Basic Water Rescue classes for American Red Cross Certifications. Most courses are taught in the Spring season at select neighborhood sites.

City of St. Petersburg offers a **Masters swim program**. This program is designed for competitive adult swimmers. Coached practices are available at North Shore Aquatics Complex and provide workouts and stroke development skills in a team atmosphere. Uncoached lap swim hours are available at Walter Fuller and Lake Vista Pools, as well as North Shore Aquatic Complex.

Swim to Stay Fit lap swimming hours are available at Lake Vista, North Shore Aquatic Complex, and Walter Fuller. Please contact the individual sites for designated hours. This program is for participants swimming laps for fitness, not competition.

Water aerobics classes are offered at North Shore Aquatic Complex. Join the aerobics group for any age or fitness level. This aerobics class is low impact and is excellent for any age group or fitness level. Classes are offered year round in a temperature controlled pool.

Triathlete Swim Training (Stroke Technique) is geared toward the beginner Triathlete or fitness swimmer with emphasis on stroke technique and distance endurance.

Private Pool Rentals



The FIVE Layers of Pool Safety

Use this simple checklist and find out if your pool area is secured by the proper “layers of protection”:

The first layer begins with YOU!

Pool safety starts with the caregiver. Persistent supervision will keep your little ones from accessing the pool area. Also, limit distractions that may interfere with supervision.



Second layer: inside the home


Have a clear view of the pool from within the house. Access to exterior doors should be limited to adults - use childproof door locks and door alarms on all doors leading to the pool area.

Third layer: outside the home

The backyard should be secured, as well as the pool area with safety fences and self-closing, self-latching gates. Use an alarm for the gate.

Keep furniture away from the safety fence - kids love to climb!



Hot tubs should have a locking cover.



Fourth layer: the pool area

Keep toys and floating objects out of the pool, and remove trip hazards from the pool's edge.

Maintain water levels three to four inches from the top. Wave alarms can be placed in the pool. Pool covers can be used when the pool is not in use.



Fifth layer: swimming lessons

Enroll in swim lessons and make sure that family members can swim too. Always swim with a buddy and make sure children are never left unattended. Use life jackets for swimmers still learning, but do not rely on these alone. Establish rules for play areas, ensuring drains and suction fittings are off-limits.

Teach children to always ask permission to swim!


