

Explanation of Web Site Statistics

The information provided is meant to inform the general public of how many calls a given station receives on an annual basis. The statistics are based on the nature of the calls. The natures are grouped together into at least four categories. A fifth category is presented when the station has a specialty unit associated with it. The specialty units are Technical Rescue (station 4), Hazardous Materials (station 5), and Marine (station 11).

There are a few items to consider when analyzing the call volume on the web site. Calls are based on the station shown on the web page. It is very possible that assistance was provided by other stations for a portion of these calls, so the call totals should not be used in conjunction with other station pages. At least one apparatus from the station shown was dispatched on each call. It is quite possible that all of the station units were dispatched on any given call. This is especially true for fire calls (one call represents the work of many units).

The list below displays examples of how the natures were grouped.
