Update re. Officers Investigate Double Shooting in which Paramedic's Truck is Struck by Gunfire

Wanted suspect Demetrius Antwan Woods, B/M, 09/10/80 turned himself in approximately 5:00 p.m. this afternoon at St. Petersburg Police headquarters with his attorney present.

He is currently being charged with two counts of shooting into an occupied vehicle, being a felon in possession of a firearm, fleeing and eluding, and driving with a suspended license.

Wanted Suspect: Demetrius Antwan Woods, B/M, 09/10/80, last known address of 4731 14 Avenue South, 5'6, 165 lbs, close cut hair and trimmed beard, tattoo nickname "Deebo" on both upper arms

Suspect Vehicle: Rented 2011 Nissan Ultima, black in color, FL tag P96-0TV.

On 08/23/11 a media alert was issued regarding a shooting which took place in the parking lot of Lundy's Liquor Store, 3084 18 Avenue South. Video of that incident was later released on 08/25/11 (see attached original release) and since that time, Suspect #1, Richard Moore, DOB 01/29/83, has been arrested and charged with being a Felon in Possession of a Firearm.

Suspect # 2 has now been identified as a Demetrius Woods and he currently remains at large. Woods is believed to be the individual armed with the assault rifle that fired from a moving vehicle and hit a paramedic truck.

This morning at about 11:10 a.m. officers spotted Woods in the area of 14 Avenue South and 40 Street driving the above described vehicle. Woods refused to stop for officers and a pursuit was authorized which lasted on and off for about 30 minutes until he was eventually lost in the area of 17 Avenue South and 42 Street.

Woods is considered armed and dangerous and detectives are actively attempting to locate him and are seeking the public's assistance. Anyone with information is asked to contact Detective Kenny Miller at 727-892-5916 or they may contact the St. Petersburg Police Tip Line at 727-892-5000.
