## Weekly Recreational Water Quality Results

As a service to residents and visitors to the Sunshine City, St. Petersburg samples and tests for recreational water quality at some of the most popular coastal venues in and around our city.

The weekly Recreational Water sampling and testing has been completed by the City of St. Petersburg [Environmental Compliance Division](#) on the near-shore waters along Tampa Bay and the Gulf of Mexico.

Listed below are the results and Water Quality Category according to the [Healthy Beaches Program](#) for Lassing Park and the Beaches from the December 26, 2018 sampling event.

• Lassing Park	4 CFU/100 ml	Good
• Maximo Beach	4 CFU/100 ml	Good
• Northshore Beach	40 CFU/100 ml	Moderate
• Treasure Island Beach	4 CFU/100 ml	Good

Lassing Park and Northshore Beach will be resampled this week due to the findings.

As a reminder, Florida Healthy Beaches Program Categories are:

- Good = 0-35 Enterococci per 100 milliliters of marine water
- Moderate = 36-70 Enterococci per 100 milliliters of marine water
- Poor = 71 or greater Enterococci per 100 milliliters of marine water
