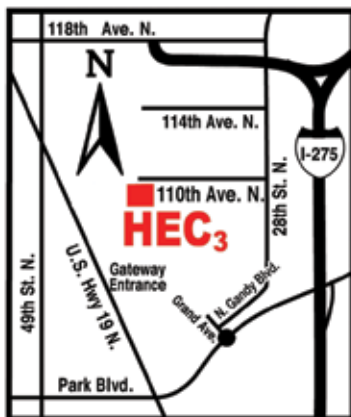

## Participate in the EnviroBusiness Hazardous Waste Collection Program

### Reduced Fees for Businesses

Businesses pay the contractors directly, at the County's reduced contract prices.

The EnviroBusiness Collection Program gives businesses an inexpensive and convenient way to dispose of their hazardous electronic and chemical waste. Most businesses have at least some hazardous waste that should be disposed of in a special manner, but they may not even realize it. Hazardous business waste can include simple things, like fluorescent light bulbs, cleaners, computers, or toner cartridges. It can also include items such as pesticides, laboratory vials, paints and automotive fluids. Businesses must find an alternate means of disposal for explosives and biomedical waste.

With increased awareness about the impact of these items on our environment, it is more critical than ever that businesses properly dispose of hazardous items. Not only is it legally mandated, but it's the right thing to do for a healthy environment.

## Chemicals

When hazardous chemicals are thrown out with other trash, they can mix with other chemicals in the garbage truck and produce toxic fumes, catch fire, or explode. Additionally, when incinerated at our waste-to-energy facility, these chemicals can negatively impact air quality. It is ILLEGAL for businesses to put these wastes in the regular trash. Eligible businesses are invited to bring their unwanted chemicals in for proper disposal. **To be eligible for chemical drop-off, businesses must qualify as conditionally exempt small quantity generators. This includes businesses that produce less than 25 gallons, or 220 pounds, of chemical waste per month.**

### Container Requirements

All waste MUST meet Dept. of Transportation (D.O.T.) shipping requirements. Waste will be packaged into D.O.T. approved containers prior to shipment when necessary. If waste is not already in an approved container, the following charges will apply:

• 85 gallon salvage drum.....	\$ 132.00	• 55 gallon steel drum... ..	\$ 30.00	• 55 gallon poly drum.....	\$ 16.25
• 30 gallon steel drum.....	\$ 18.75	• 30 gallon fiber drum... ..	\$ 22.50	• 20 gallon fiber drum.....	\$ 29.38

## Electronics

Studies have determined that cathode ray tubes found in computers and TVs contain significant amounts of lead, which contaminates incinerator ash and negatively impacts air emissions. These same contaminants can leach into the landfill and threaten the drinking water supply. Other electronics, such as radios and cellular phones, contain elevated levels of mercury and other harmful metals. It is ILLEGAL for businesses to put any of these wastes in the regular trash.



**All businesses are eligible** and invited to get the lead out of the waste stream by bringing in their hazardous electronic waste for proper disposal and recycling. Over 90% of all the electronic equipment brought in is either reused or recycled.

### NO CHARGE ITEMS

- Audiovisual equipment such as radios, tape players, stereos, VCRs, and speakers
- CPUs / Laptops
- Small household electrical appliances such as microwaves, power tools, and health/beauty items
- Telecommunications devices such as desk phones, cell phones, pagers, and modems
- UPS power protection equipment
